




With IBM synchronization you exploded with them from classrooms every fifty-five minutes.




You heard the firm voices who occasionally had to govern hairlines, hemlines and overzealous lunch tray-carriers.



More often, you heard them guiding those who sought knowledge or counsel.


You and a thousand other students, spurred on by the boundless encouragement of cheerleaders, raised your voices in tumultuous discord,






pounding waves of electric excitement into the spine of every athletic performer.

And there were other voices: combined into exalted chorus by the sweep of two skillful hands,






enhanced by the written words of Shakespeare and the sure guidance of the experienced, challenged by the world to defend an idea, a belief.




And there is more which is reflected in this school. The walls, eight years old now, remember the worried expressions of the sophomores, the knowing countenances of the juniors and seniors,




and the unconcerned air of the stray dogs which invariably sauntered in through open doors. Some walls will always remember the weight of our roof.

You have seen the tranquil expansion of a city below,






and the frenzied activity of clubs within, those firmly established and those newly organized.



And will you not forget the reincarnation of Tom Paines's immortal paper, nor the rampant radiators... which plagued some of us?






For many, who had sounded their voices in Jefferson's halls for three warm winters, there was a climax.



For the rest there was an inspiration for tomorrow,




and for a special few there was the wonderment and excitement of a new land to hold forever.





### Mr. Jack Graham Joins Jefferson Administration

Mr. Paxson, chief administrator, is overseer of all activities at Jefferson. He has served the school since its opening in 1957. He was previously principal at McKinley when it was a high school. He received his BA from Parsons College and his MA from the University of Iowa.

Mr. Paxson is responsible for the hiring of the faculty and tending to their requests. He presides at the monthly faculty meetings, and he also is in charge of faculty-student relationships. He spends his summer months plan-

ning 1900 students' schedules and approximately 95 teachers' room assignments.

Mr. Paxson is a past president of the Cedar Rapids Kiwanis Club and past president of the Principals and Supervisors in this school system. He has been a member of both the Iowa and National Associations of Secondary Principals for thirty years. Mr. Paxson has also been named a life member of the N.E.A. (National Education Association) of which he has been a member for fifteen years.

Mr. Williams, Assistant Principal, is the Activities Coordinator. He is in charge of all drama, music, athletics, and clubs. His great interest in youth makes his job interesting and exciting.

Mr. Williams got his BA degree from William Penn College and his MA degree from Drake University. He previously taught science at Franklin before coming to Jefferson as Assistant Principal when the school was opened in 1957. His most interesting experiences involve chaperoning student tours.



### Brink Award Initiated for Excellence in Writing


The English department honored its devoted chairman this year in establishing the Eveadell Brink Award. The award, which consists of a twenty-five dollar check to be used at the winner's discretion, will be given annually to the student who demonstrates the most highly developed writing skills in an essay.

Dr. Kenneth Donelson, former Jefferson faculty member who judged this year's entries, chose senior Steve Vosatka as the recipient of the first writing award. Steve's essay on the responsibility of protest was printed in the Gazette and as a supplement to Venture.

Providing students with good

communications skills is the English department's aim. The curriculum stresses literature and writing but also offers many opportunities for oral work.

A new language arts course was offered this year. It is part of a large program designed to provide college-bound seniors with sufficient backgound to test out of at least part of freshman English and still receive credit for those hours in the colleges participating in the program. The course is known as the Advanced Standing Program in English, or simply A.S.P.; and its focal point is composition, both oral and written.





## Variety of Math Courses Offered to Jeff Students.

The mathematics department is interested solely in preparing Jefferson students with the kind of background they will need in life. The program of study ranges from classes in basic arithmetic, a knowledge of which is essential for everyone, to classes in advanced mathematics, for those students who are planning to take mathematics courses in college.

This year the department offered a new course to Jefferson students. The course, Numerical Analysis, provided students with an introduction to computers. Those taking the course learned some of the fundamentals of computer programming and became familiar with Jefferson's IBM equipment.

Jefferson students again took part in the mathematics contest, which is sponsored annually by the Mathematical Association of America. The department gives a Mathematics Award each year to the student who gets the best score in the contest. Bill Coppock was this year's winner.

Jefferson ranked quite highly a mong the two-hundred-one schools that entered their scores in the state competition. The individual scores of the two best Jefferson contestants, Coppock and Gary Metelak, ranked fifteenth and eighteenth in the state, respectively. Our team score--a composite of Coppock's Metelak's and Marvin Schroeder's scores--ranked seventh in the state,



#### Science Department Offers Varied Courses

Courses in the Science Department range from Biology to Physics. In order to graduate a student needs two years of science. As a sophomore he can take Biology. As a junior or senior he can take Chemistry and when a senior, Physics or Physical Science. In Biology he learns the process of life from simple cells to reproduction of mammals. In Chemistry he discovers the slide rule, the elements and the combination of these elements. Physics demands a broader Math background than Biology or Chemistry, and in Physics the student becomes acquainted with some of the physical properties of matter such as: heat, light, mass, momentum, gravity, and sound. Physical Science is not as taxing a course as Physics. In this course the student learns basic science theories that are helpful in daily life.

The Science Department staff this year was under the guidance of Mr. Stolar, Physics teacher. Mr. Ted Lawrence, Physical Science instructor, resigned at mid-year to accept a coaching position at the University of Iowa. He was replaced by Mr. Leo Mork.



Records are also made available for students to practice with at

The most important advance in the driver education department was the passage of the driver education bill by the state legislature. As a result of that bill, residents of Iowa may not get a driver's license until they are eighteen unless they have successfully completed a driver education course. The bill also provides for a state reimbursement to the department for each driver education student.

Driver education is divided into three areas--classroom, lab, and cars--and is handled on a team teaching basis. Every effort is made to give students experience in driving under all road conditions. In the lab, driving simulators are used to provide those situations that cannot be experienced in the cars, such as freeway driving and various emergencies. The lab now features a new cinemascope screen and color films to make lab driving seem more like the real thing.

Homemaking classes are great fun for girls because there are many opportunities for them to learn the latest about every Tom, Dick, and Harry. In all seriousness, however, most homemaking students seek to define their values in life, to sharpen cooking and sewing skills, to learn new ideas, and to gain a basic knowledge of household operations.

The major areas of study are, of course, foods and clothing. In the foods unit students learn not only cooking techniques, but also marketing, meal planning, table etiquette, and how to digest an occasional flop. Besides actual garment construction, the clothes unit covers fabric selction, fabric care, fa shions, and the basic principle that "a stitch in time

saves nine."
Students often work on in-

dividual projects outside of class. These projects range from cleaning a closet to sewing a dress, from learning to eat a good breakfast every day to losing weight, from trying to freeze an egg to analyzing a meat pie for nutritional value, and from creating a centerpiece to planning, cooking, and serving a family meal.

The homemaking department administers the Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow test to all its senior students each year. Sandy Trachta had the highest score this year and represented Jefferson in the stale contest. For her efforts Sandy received a pin from Betty Crocker.

There was a new face on the homemaking staff this year as Miss Connie Davenport took over Mrs. JoAnn Bodeker's classes.






### Office Staff and Library Staff








Victorious J-Hawks carry Coach Lawrence off the field after winning the mythical state championship by defeating Davenport Central, 20-18.



The 1965 J-Hawks opened their season by traveling to West Waterloo to take on George Dutcher's Wahawks in a match of the Big Six Conference against the Mississippi Valley Conference. The game proved a mismatch as the J-Hawk's offense gained 447 yards and scored eight touchdowns for a total of 53 points. Jon Meskimen, Ted Knutson, Craig Shaver, Scoop Hellentall, and Tim Kelley all scored TD's while Larry Baker collected two. Quarterbacks Larry Lawrence, B. J. Trickey, and Tom Blevins all threw touchdown passes. The first team defense limited the Wahawks to just twenty total yards in the first half. The J-Hawk defense was led by Bill Bevill, Gar McCormick, Layne McDowell, and Roger Barnard.

The J-Hawks entertained the East Moline Panthers in their home opener of the 1965 season and notched their second lopsided victory of the young season, 48-0. Ted Knutson scored three touchdowns while Scoop Hellentall, Jon Meskimen, and Bob Rudd got one each. Ron McDonald kicked six of seven extra points for the night. The tough J-Hawk defense held East Moline to 24 yards.

Jeff finished the night with 526 yards gained and eight touchdowns. Jon Meskimen, Steve Zobac, Bob Kohl, Joe Schmickle, and Larry Lawrence provided the scoring punch as Meskimen and Zobac each scored two and the others one touchdown each. Lawrence, Trickey, and Blevins did a fine job passing as they completed 12 out of 20 attempts for 300 yards.

In a driving rainstorm, the J-Hawks downed previously undefeated West Davenport, 14-7. Jeff scored first on a 42 yard pass from Larry Lawrence to Scoop Hellentall. West came right back to tie the score at halftime, 7-7. In the second half the J-Hawks recovered a West fumble and drove 31 yards to score on a quarterback sneak by Lawrence. The punting of Bob Simanek and Jon Meskimen was outstanding as they averaged 36 yards per kick on a very wet and muddy field. The J-Hawk defense held West to four yards in the last half and the whole J-Hawk squad showed the ability to play like champions under the most difficult situations.

Jeff was shooting for their fifth straight victory over their eastern neighbors and they achieved it in a convincing manner. Ted Knutson scored three touchdowns while Craig Shaver and Tim Kelley each were on the receiving end of a touchdown pass. Again the J-Hawk defense was great as they held the Warriors to 68 total yards gained. Garland McCormick had 12 tackles, which was the highest number of tackles for an individual in a single game during the 1965 season.

The Little Hawks of Iowa City came to Kingston Stadium determined to end the J-Hawk's unbeaten string. Iowa City was the last conference team to beat the J-Hawks in Kingston Stadium back in the third game of the 1961 season. The fine passing of Mike Cilek and Steve Piro couldn't dent the J-Hawk armor as the Jeff defense held the rushing game of Iowa City to a -- 20 yards for the night. Jefferson touchdowns came through the efforts of Ted Knutson, Bob Kohl, Joe Schmickle, Jon Meskimen, Tim Kelley, Roger Barnard, and Emmit Omar, with Schmickle and Knutson each collecting two to provide the J-Hawks with a comfortable 59-0 margin. Both teams performed like champions as mistakes were few and outstanding plays were frequent. Jeff started the scoring as Lawrence hit Hellentall with a long pass and Meskimen carried it in on a four yard plunge. Davenport countered with a touchdown just before the half ended but missed the extra point which enabled the J-Hawks to carry a 7-6 advantage into the halftime. Jeff moved 65 yards in the third quarter to score as Lawrence again hit Hellentall on a 19 yard TD pass. However within a period of 84 seconds, Davenport scored on a 20 yard run and an 85 yard touchdown pass for an 18-14 Central lead. With seven minutes remaining, the J-Hawks received the kickoff and Kohl returned it to his own 28-yard line. Jeff then marched to the Davenport 14 on a great catch and pass from Lawrence to Hellentall. Meskimen carried for four yards, and with one minute remaining, Larry Lawrence made a spectacular run on the option play to score the most precious touchdown of the season. Jon Meskimen recovered a Central fumble as time ran out on probably the best high school football game ever witnessed in Iowa. It was a great victory and showed that the J-Hawks were deserving of being called champions, because they came back just as true champions





The hard work put into building this fine squad emphasizes the importance that the varsity coaches place on a strong crop of sophomore athletes.

The J-Hawks captured the league title on their next-to-the-last game before suffering a 20-19 last-second loss to Davenport Central on the final day of the season. But even this loss couldn't dull the excellent shine of the young J-Hawk record. One of the most important triumphs of the year came against cross-town rival Washington. 

Pre-season pick to tie for fourth place in the Mississippi Valley Conference with one Illinois team, while the other two fight for first: the 1965-66 J-Hawks surprised everyone. The J-Hawks played a major role in the end of the Illinois domination with a second place finish, highest ever for an Iowa team.

Jeff opened with an easy 81-74 victory over a ranked Washington, Iowa team, but then ran into trouble. A hot-shooting Rock Island team invaded an untested Jefferson; coming out with an 95-85 victory. Next Jeff played Clinton, the only team to twice beat the J-Hawks. Shooting at an incredible 60 percent, Clinton took the first game 76-67. The second game preceded a long winning streak, with the River Kings the victors 66-56 in a foul filled contest. The J-Hawks then began to jell for a while, as their first 60 percent shooting spelled defeat for Davenport West, 72-63. And another victory over cross-town rival Washington 70-60 evened their record at two and two. Near disaster followed though, as a seldom miss East Moline brought on a 99-79 defeat. This game forced Jefferson to switch to a zone defense; and their season went 12 wins and 2 losses afterward. Jeff next defeated Davenport Central 71-57, and Dubuque 87-65. But another cold J-Hawk night brought on the second Clinton defeat 66-56.






















And next came the anual mid-season splurt, as the J-Hawks began to key on defense, and ten straight victories shot them to a second place finish. Beginning with a 57-55 victory over Iowa City in another foul filled game; Jefferson avenged the near loss in their second meeting, 82-62. The second victory over Davenport Central 65-60 preceded the second victory over last place Dubuque 70-46. And then came Jefferson's top two games of the year. First was Washington, hot off of six straight wins; two over Illinois schools, and a slim loss to Moline. The J-Hawks responded with a 75-56 runaway. And the defending champs, untested in league play, next brought their unblemished record to Jefferson. Hot shooting, pressure defense, and an unbeatable spirit handed the J-Hawks a 66-57 victory--High point of the season. A rest followed, as Jeff reserves led an 85-68 rout of Marion. And next Jefferson avenged a costly loss to Rock Island, 54-50. And a second victory over Davenport West 47-44 added to the 10 game winning streak. Jeff's final conference record was 12 wins and 4 losses, one game behind repeating Champion Moline. Next came a disastrous tournament.

A ten point deficit was overcome once; but a slow and deliberate Washington offense came out on top. Jefferson's worst shooting percentage of the whole year, 21 percent, spelled defeat.

Not one single standout, the J-Hawks worked as a complete team. Four boys averaged in double figures, with Pat Driscoll leading at 15 points per game. However Bob Sample, B.J. Trickey, and Larry Baker were close behind. From the center position, Larry Baker had an amazing 60 percent shooting average. Larry was also the leading rebounder on the team. Getting an amazing 21 rebounds in one single game, and 17 in four others; Larry was close to the rebounding record with 257. Bob Sample, last year's leader was second with 183













Students participating in dramatics are offered experience in almost every phase of the theatre with the advantages of excellent stage facilities. The auditorium seats 800 people and has a stage which is 42 feet wide and 35 feet deep. The stage is equipped with a large counterweight system and a complete switchboard controlling a high quality lighting set up. Adjoining the stage is a spacious scenery shop for set construction and a costume room that has accumulated nearly 1000 different costumes. Thus a Jefferson production is no minor undertaking and often involve between 50 and 150 people in both cast and crews.

#### Fall Play Recreates

"From Rags To Riches," a play so old and unread that it was out of print, was presented to Jefferson audiences on November 11, 12, and 13 as an example of the drama popular in America in the late 1800's. The melodrama is known for its trite plots, heroes and villains, exaggerated gestures, and the hisses and boos of the audience.

In Jefferson's authentic melodrama, Flossie, an innocent and fragile girl, is kidnapped by the sinister Charlie. Ned Nimble, Flossie's virtuous brother who works hard to support his sister, heroically rescues Flossie from the villain. After inheriting the fortune of an unknown relative, the two live happily and prosperously.

Ned Nimble protects his sister from the throes of the evil Charlie, who has made passes at her.










