colored moments of today.












**The sea runs** without end









Kate and Constance are the daughter and niece of Mr. and Mrs. Hardcastle (Steve Burk and Debby Larson). 





**Pigs,** horses, cows, and chickens . . . all plotting to revolt? "Golden Future Time," an original musical, came to life in January on the Jefferson stage. The play, based on George Orwell's "Animal Farm," was written by a committee of ASP students, other language arts students, and teachers. The plot deals with animals overruling people and constructing rules of their own under which to live. The Seven Commandments become their basic code with the whole idea the human beings are not good. After a period of time, the pigs become the controlling force, only to break their own rules and conquer all the other animals. The pigs drastically change and begin to take on human characteristics which completely defeats the revolution's purpose. The two major items conveyed to the audience are the political and moral implications. Gib Ziemer and Terry Vik gave Mr. Geuder a break as they took over directing duties completely for the two performances.


























































