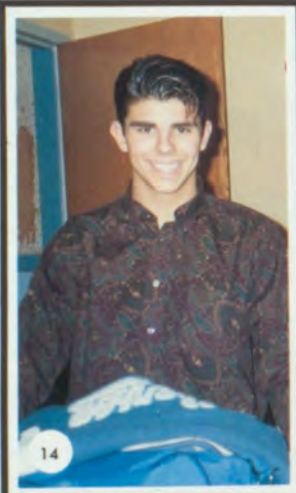
Forever in time

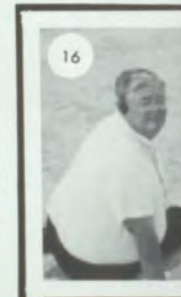

Amy Vanous and Jennifer Taylor went to Des Moines for a business horizons program. Amy said

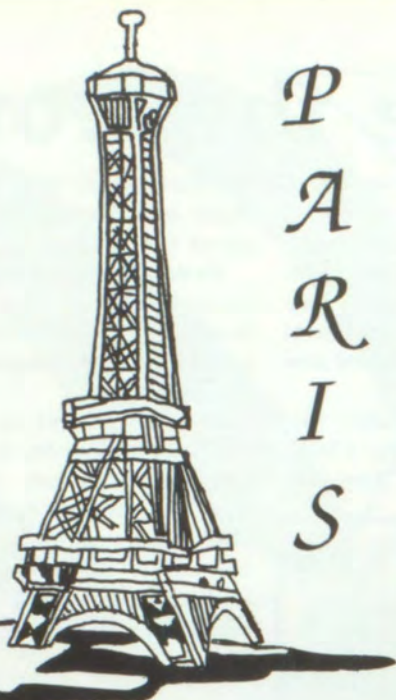
she met people from all over the state and learned a great deal about business.

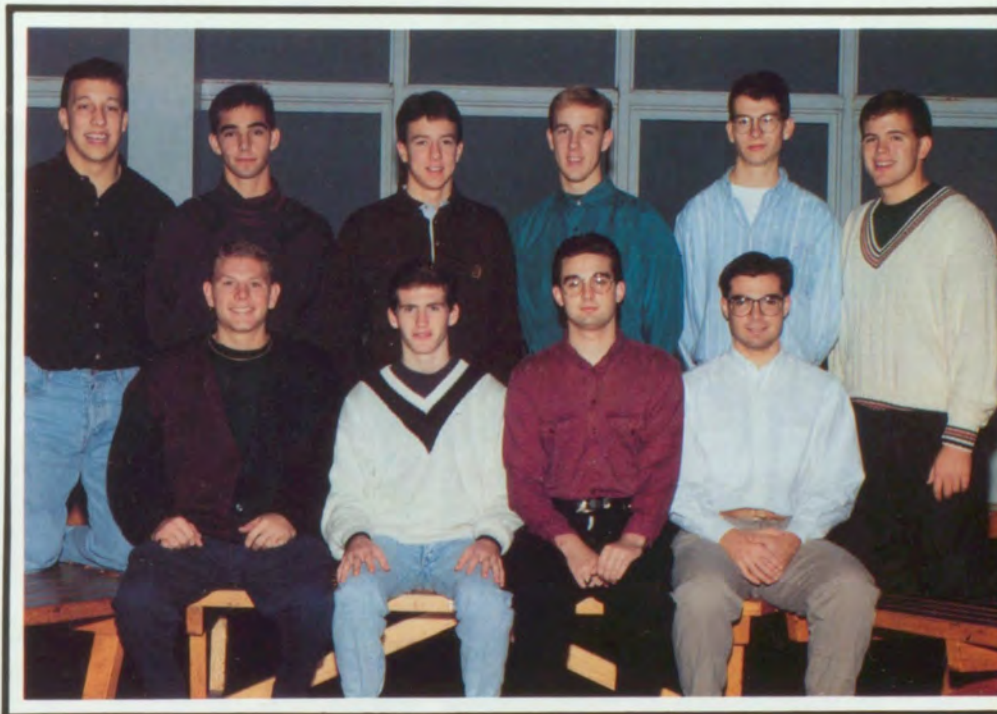

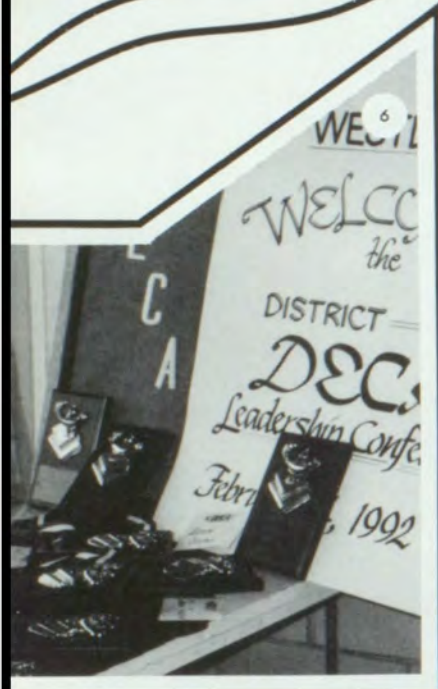

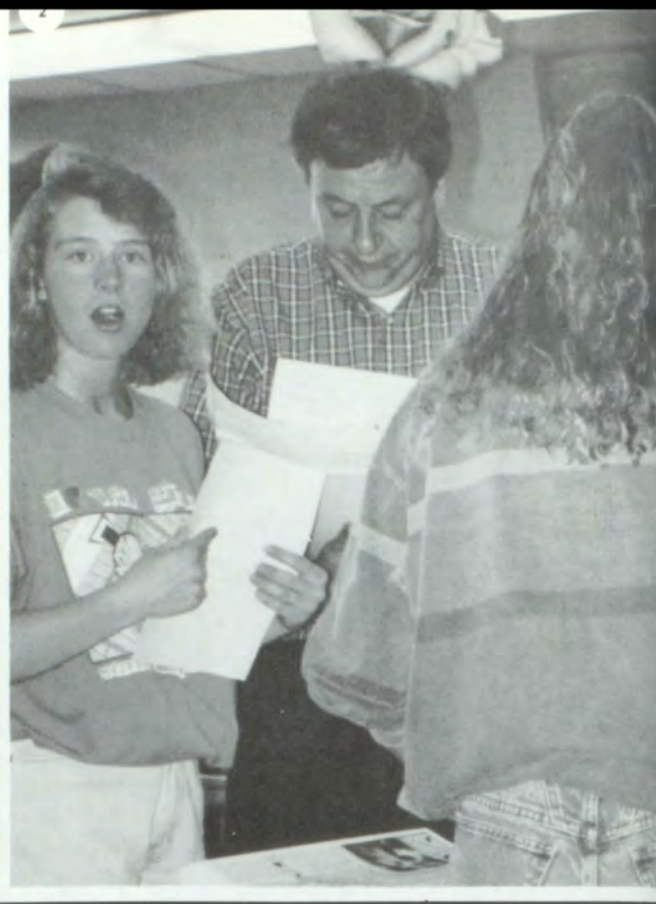

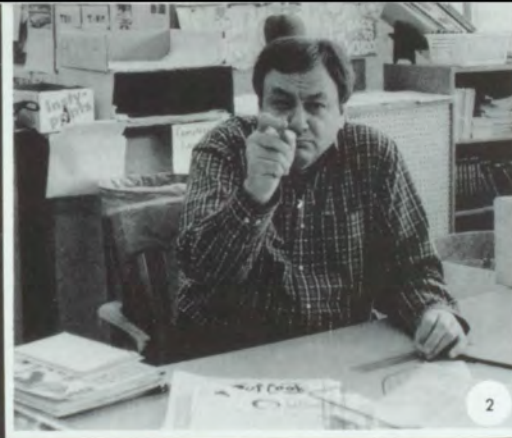

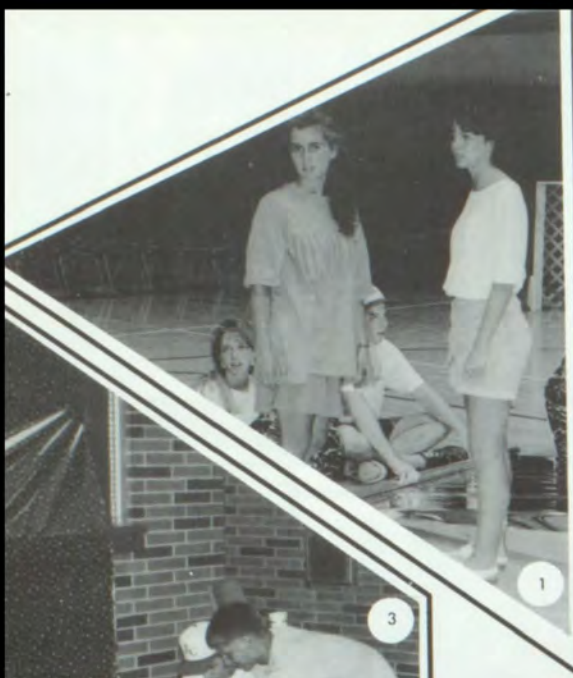
Four class sen

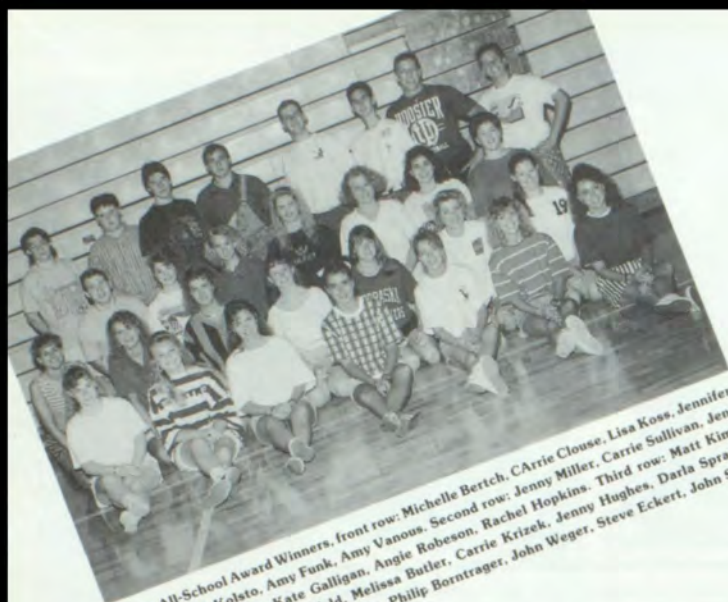

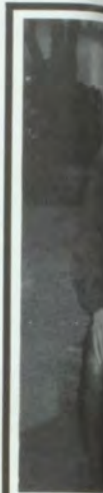

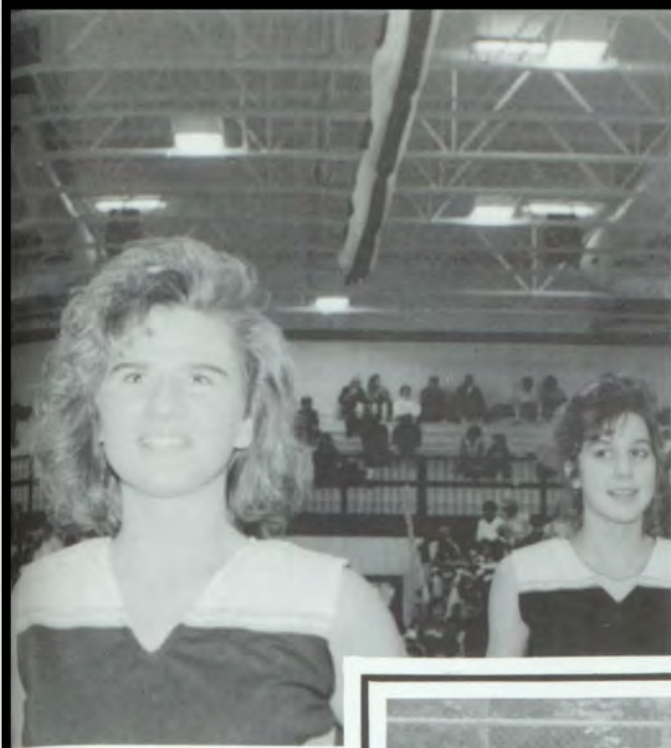

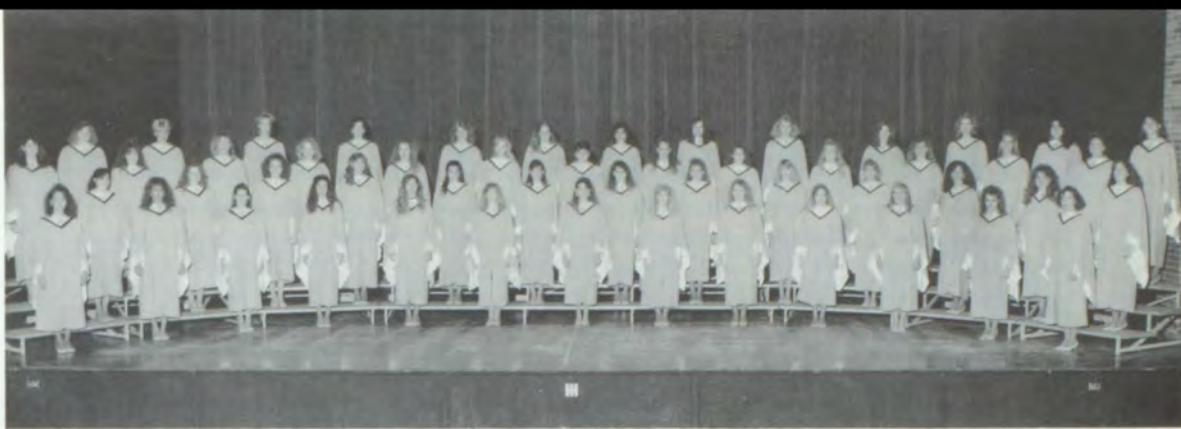
This year the concert choir women received a great honor by being accepted to perform at the

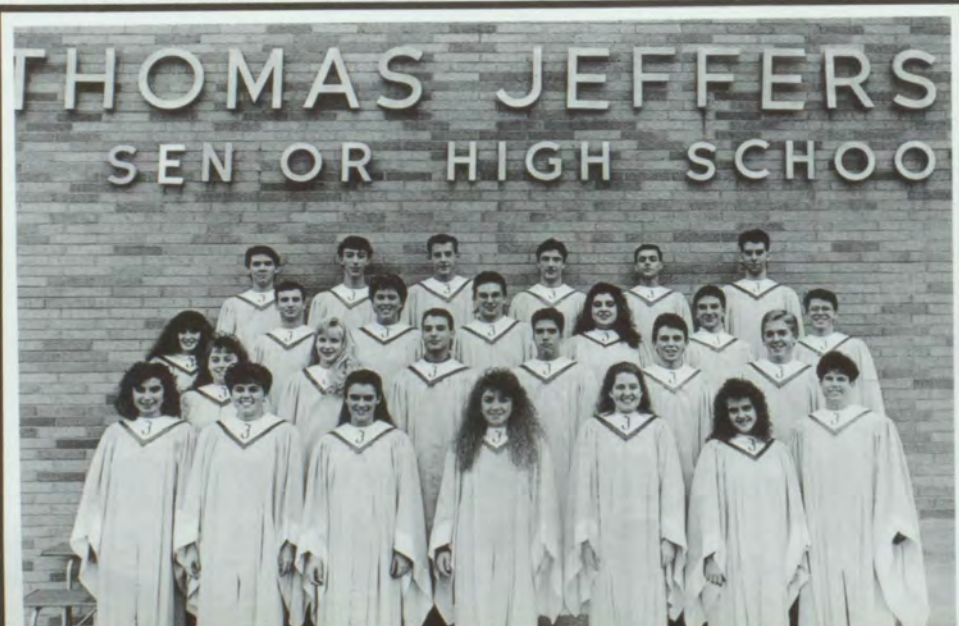

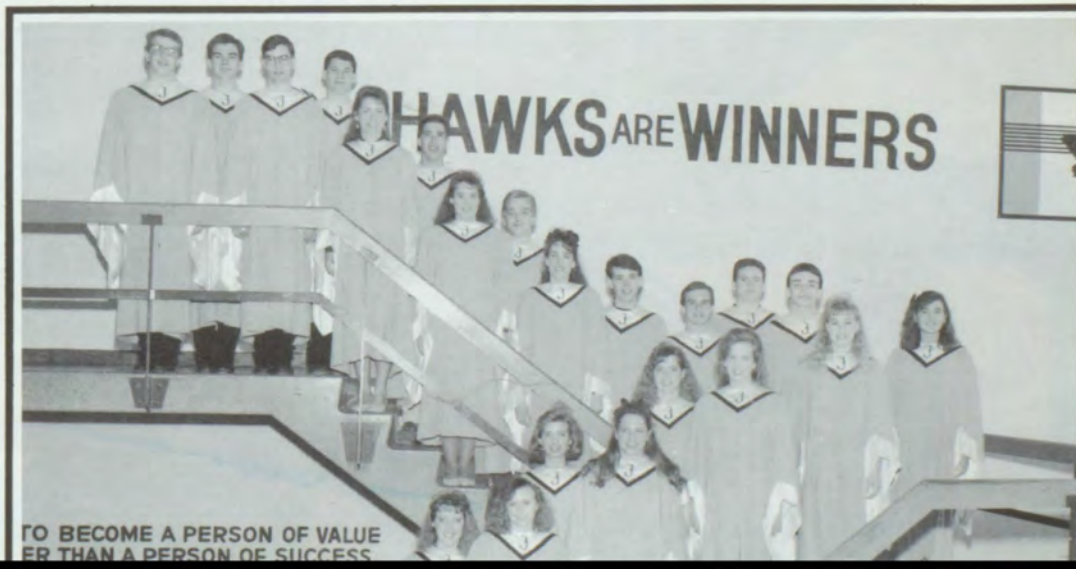

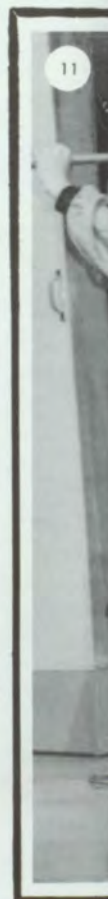
Story has twist

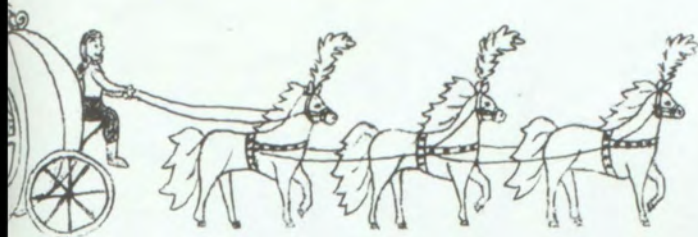
... They lived happily ever after.

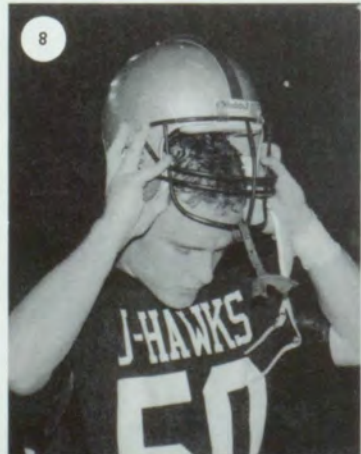

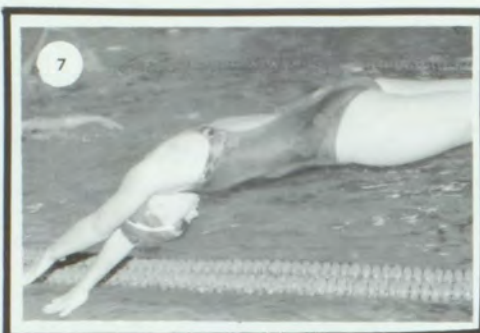

A year of changes

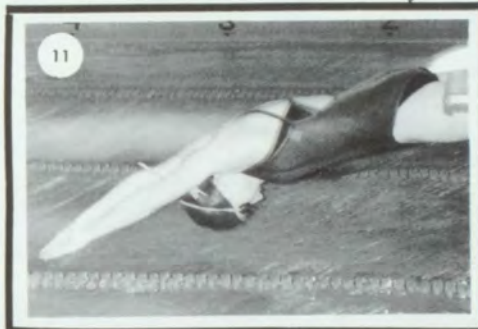

Ms. Sandee Walton turned over her position as cheerleader supervisor to Mrs. Jan Tower in December.

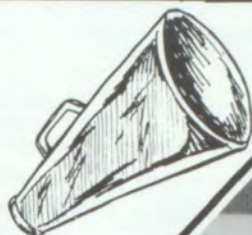
Mrs. Tower stated, "It was an enjoyable experience, but hectic with all the duties."

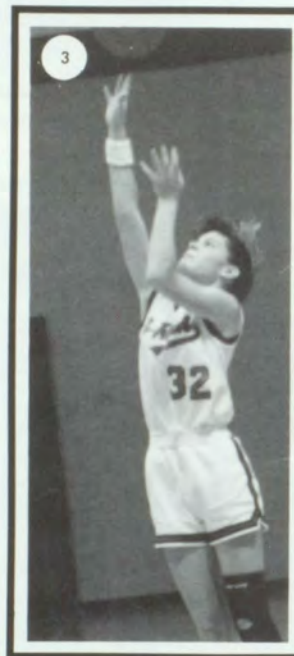

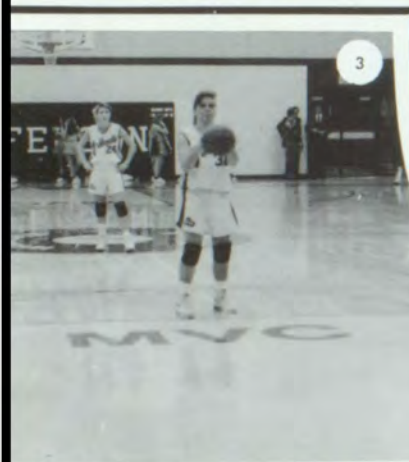
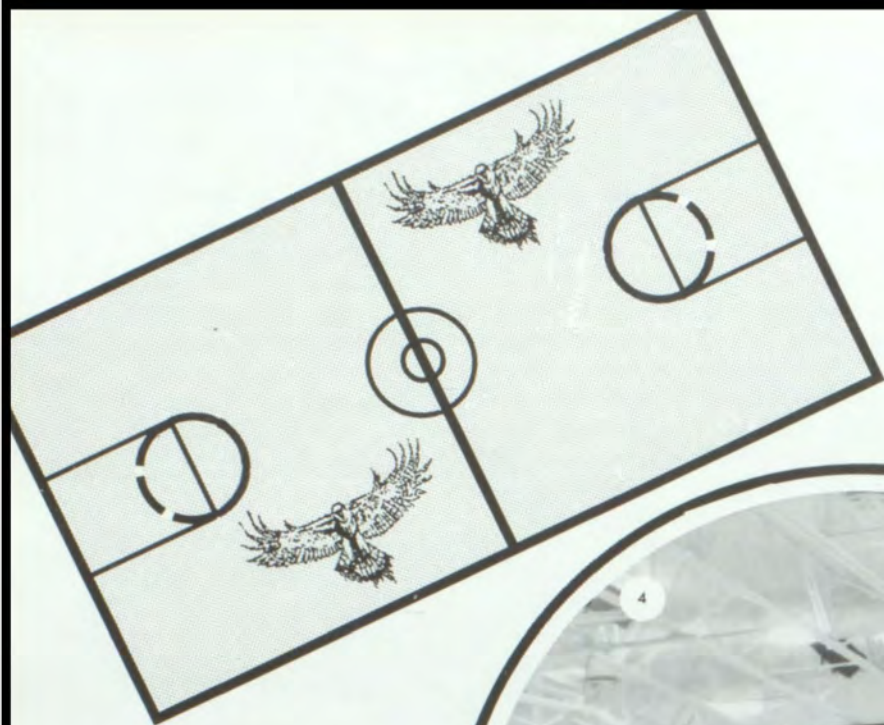

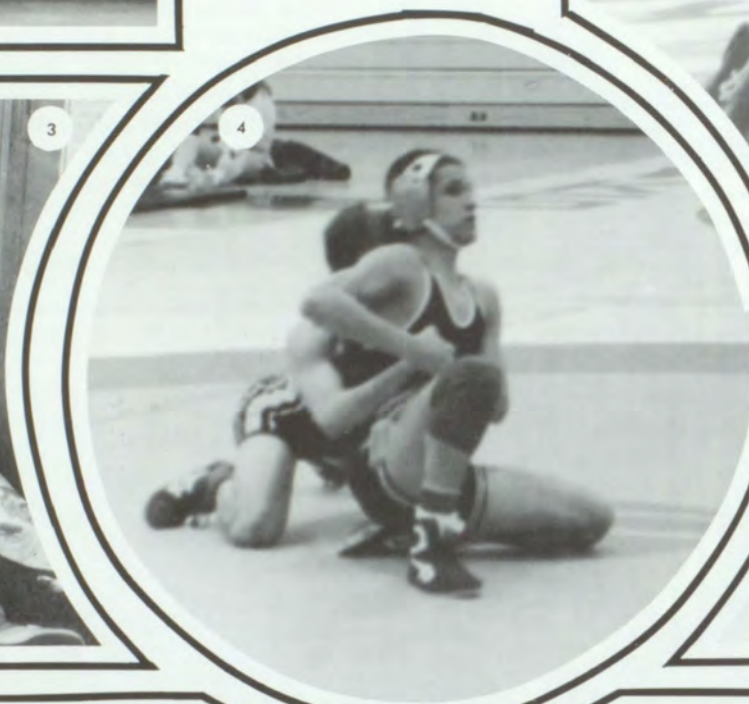

ty feels that the wrestlers need to lift weights more and wrestle in freestyle tournaments in the off season.

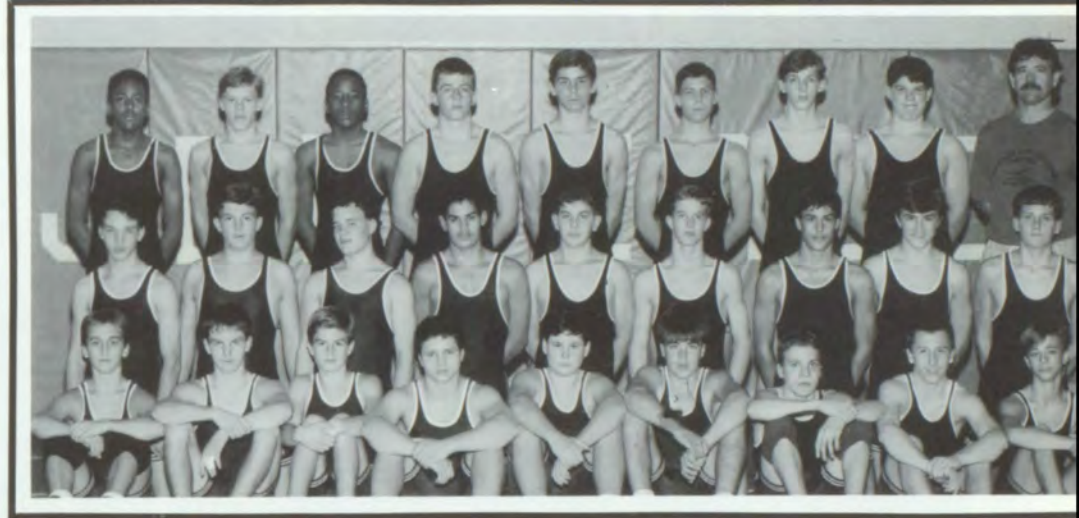

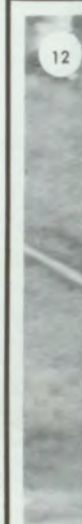
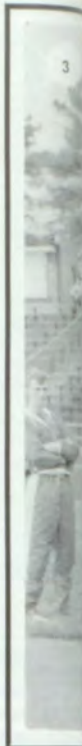
The thing that attributed most to the season was the team unity and the positive mental attitudes they

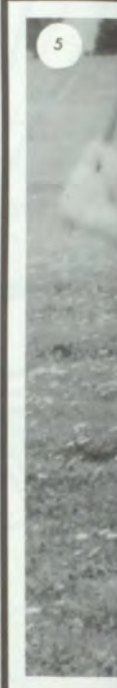

High School is not just books and boring classes, it's also about fun and being with friends.

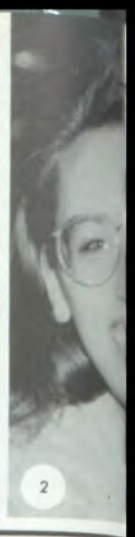

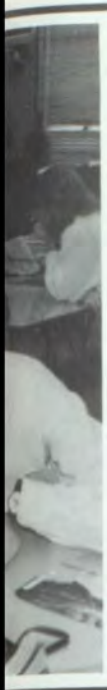

As the soon-to-be graduates lined up ready to enter the arena, one could see the excitement on their faces.

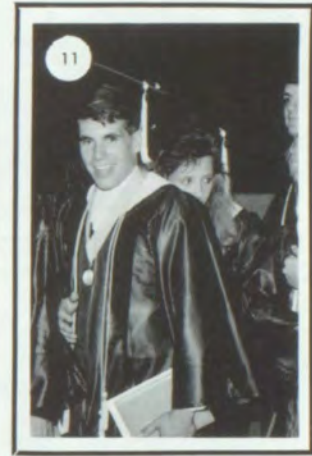
Of the 364 graduates,
