





Obviously, 1993 was a year for winners at Jefferson High School. This year will be remembered by everyone for the outstanding achievements of our students.





All four classes then compete for the spirit stick in a competition of who can yell the loudest and which class shows the most school spirit.








### Band tributes Bernstein














### We believe in music

Our excellent fine arts department has been very active this year and it continues to improve year after vear.








### Girls' big honor

To enhance the actors' performance, a neutral set with an interchangeable background was used, and gave the play a universal effect, explained Mr. Erbe.





A story of the faith of childhood and the mostalgic memories of the adult world, this play had something for all ages. Everyone dreams sometime.





























#### Hard work is their key




## Spirits rise





The freshmen and sophomore team did well this season also. Sophomore Andrea Beauregard played the #1 spot.


All in all, the girls' tennis team had a great season. Although the rain put a damper on their practices, the girls stayed focused on the 'ball', and are looking forward to the next season.










## **Electives at school**

J-Hawks for Life sponsored the after prom party, featuring karoake.












