# Anne's memory lives <br> "In spite of everything, I still <br> the eight people who took 

believe that people are really good at heart."

These words were recorded forever in the "Diary of Anne Frank," the play presented by Jefferson's Theater Department this winter. The portrayal was so powerful and the acting so exceptional that the cast has been invited to perform mainstage at the International Thespian Festival. Only 12 groups from around the world receive this honor yearly in Indiana.

The play was a story of hope and courage, factors essential for the survival of
refuge from the Nazis in a secret annex. Strength was found in the love that Anne, played by freshman Hannah Jeffrey, kept in a world full of hate.

Adding to the success of the play was the unity of the cast. Amy Muzingo felt that, "By the time we performed we were as close as a real family. The anger, fear, and courage of our characters all became real to us."

It also became real to each of the audiences for the three performances who were thrilled with the dynamic pre-
