

It's not easy being involved. There is stress, and usually a lack of sleep and leisure time, but you become a better person — a real champion.








































# Teams run to success

The 1993 girls' swim team had themselves another great season. Coach Heather Feuerhelm was named Metro Coach of the Year, and led the girls to a winning season of 7-1. The J-Hawks finished 3rd at conference and 2nd at districts.

This season saw the J-Hawks take down five school records. Two relays were broken, the medley relay consisting of Laura Marz, Jodiue Prouty, Tracie Keizer, and Cindy Robeson, and also the 400 free relay of Amy Gardner, Tracie Keizer, Cindy Robeson, and Traci Koch. This record was previously held by Coach Feuerhelm and three of her teammates. Cindy Robeson claimed the 100 free-style, which was 21-years-old. Traci Koch took down the 200 freestyle record.

At districts, the J-Hawks qualified eight swimmers and two divers in a combined total of tern events. Qualifiers included Jennifer Giddings in diving, Amy Gardner in the 200 and 400 free relays, Jodie Prouty in the 100 breaststroke and 200 medley relay, Cindy Robeson in the 50 and 100 freestyle, the 200 medley relay, and the 400 free relay, and Kim Weeks in the 200 free relay. Also, Tracie Keizer in the 100 back and butterfly, 200 medley relay and 400 free relay, Dani Reid in the 200 free relay, Dawn Joseph in diving, Traci Koch in the 100 and 200 free and the 200 and 400 free relay, and Laura

Marz in the 100 back and 200 medley relay.

Jennifer Giddings was crowned district champion in diving and at state finished an outstanding fourth place. The team finished eleventh overall.

At the awards banquet, Kim Weeks was named Sparkplug, Co-Captain, and received the James C. Taylor award. Cindy Robeson was voted most valuable, hardest worker, and Co-Captain. Freshman Laura Marz received the most improved award.

Much of the team's success came from the members' unity. "We all got along great which helped us achieve our goals," said senior Kim Weeks.





This year was a special one for Dick Briggs, who not only coached his 100th victory as a head coach—it was also his 100th as a J-Hawk






# JV's dominates








## Team earns goals






## Seniors lead team

## Dreams come true





According to Shannon



Even with all the rain, Jefferson students still managed to have a great summer vacation. But when summer ended and classes resumed, it wasn't the end — it was a new beginning.



















## Hold on to the week


The excitement of Homecoming had begun to fill the halls of Jefferson the week of September 13th. Jefferson was to play Waterloo East the night of September 16th.

At MORP, Mike Schmidt, a senior, laughed, "I had fun doing








the chicken dance!"




# Women's choice ... A night for men







With positive comments like these, it is obvious that teachers at Jefferson are more interested and willing to teach more than just the basics today.




















# Thespians work
