## Musicians score highly

Our Fine Arts Department has done it again! On October 21, J-Hawk musicians traveled to Independence for All-State Music Festival auditions and had 36 students accepted - a very high honor.

Such an accomplishment isn't easily attained. Instrumentalists such as Susan Hoelz mentioned that she tried to practice at least an hour each day for months while soprano Jill Tonsfeldt noted, "Every day was filled with a simple humming of one of the songs or an in-depth rehearsal with your quartet."

The auditioning process was quite different for each group. While instrumentalists had to play 3 scales, 2 etudes, and
a prepared solo, vocalists had a 4 part a cappella tryout with sections of 8 songs. After all of this, recalls were made before the final cuts.

In all, 8 instrumentalists were selected along with 28 vocalists. Considering that a maximum of 28 vocalists can audition, and all of ours were accepted, is extremely impressive as alto Andrea Foster agreed. "It was a great accomplishment for Jefferson, Dr. Eklund, and Ms. Tralau. I'm glad I could be a part of it!" Our AllState musicians performed November 18 and definitely made us proud.
