

Jefferson students had a good time inside the classroom too, but most readily agree that time spent away from class was certainly much more fun!












At the season's end, Coach Krejci announced her resignation as head coach to pursue other interests, including looking after a newborn child and continuing work toward a graduate degree.





Next season the J-Hawks look to have not only another strong season, but a return trip to the state tournament, something that was missing this season.













Looking back over the season, the J-Hawk women's team improved not only as a team, but, each player stepped up their game and helped the team overcome all the challenges that were given to them.








Besides learning how to play golf from two great coaches, athletes also get to learn a sport they can enjoy for the rest of their lives, noted Matt Glover.

The seasons are set up so that boys compete in the fall and girls still participate during the spring sports season. Most athletes surveyed said that they like this method of participation.







Brooke Ralston, a sophomore,
































Kids deal together








