The downside to winter term are the two long months of January and February. This is the time of cold temperatures and practically no early dismissals or days off. Although this year everyone was

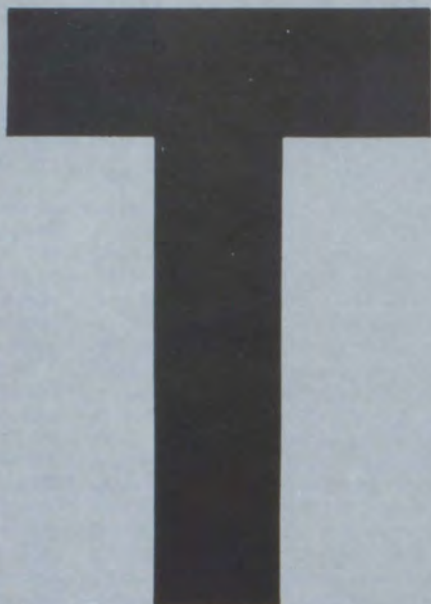

## Annual event moved to old gym; King and queen reign at dance

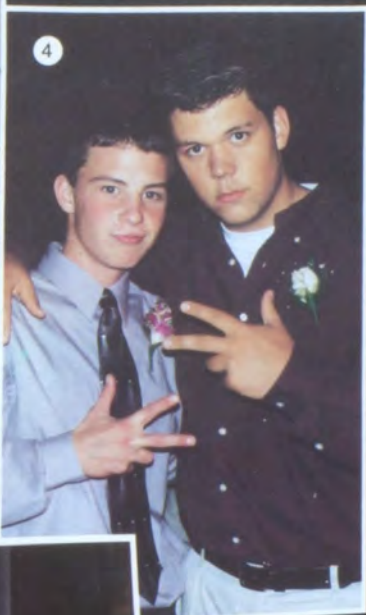

tickets right away. Everyone looks forward to doing something different once in awhile and since this is the only other dance besides Homecoming for underclassmen, everyone looks forward to the event.

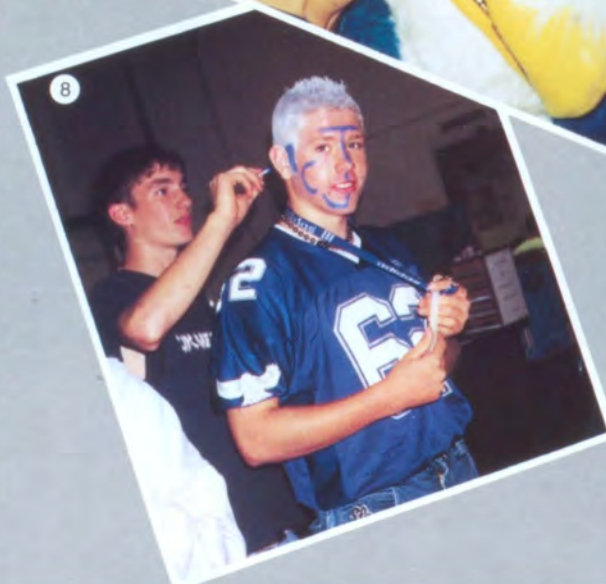

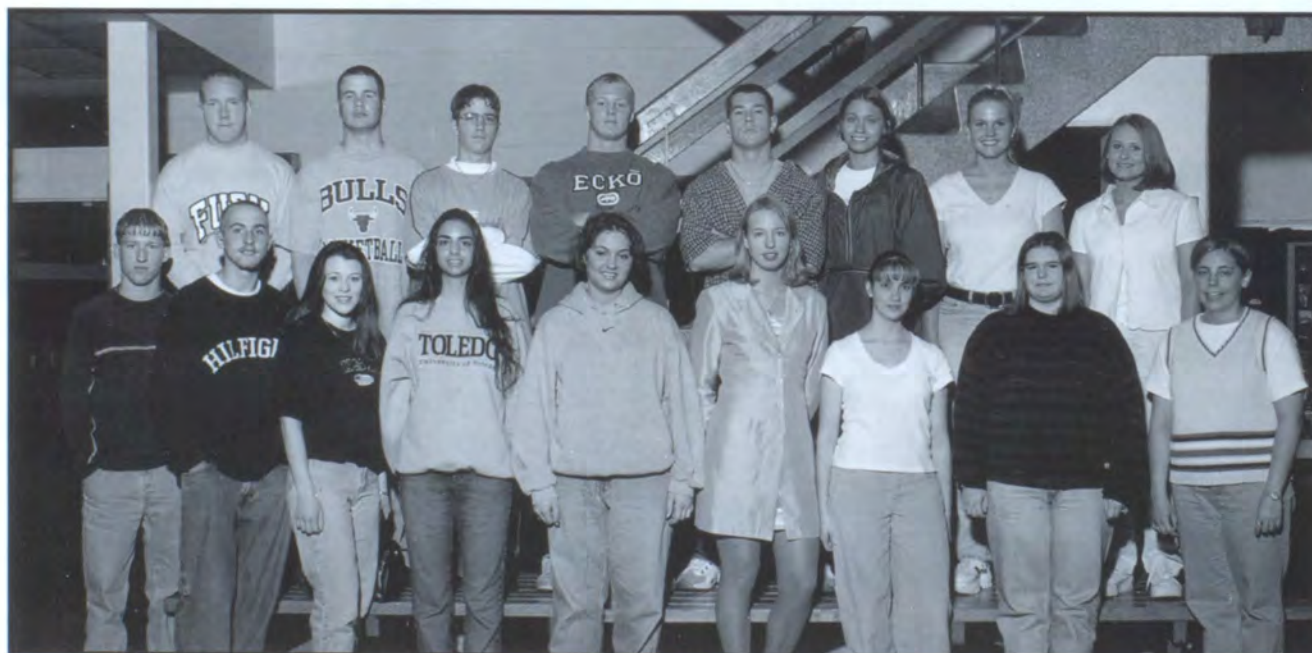


# Workers learn skills

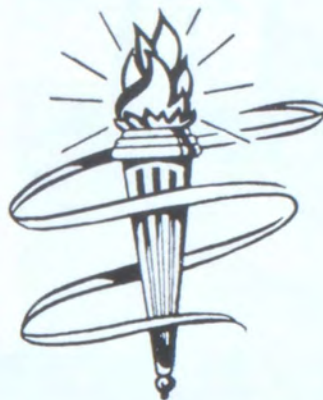

**Ms. Tralau:** Let's just say too much.

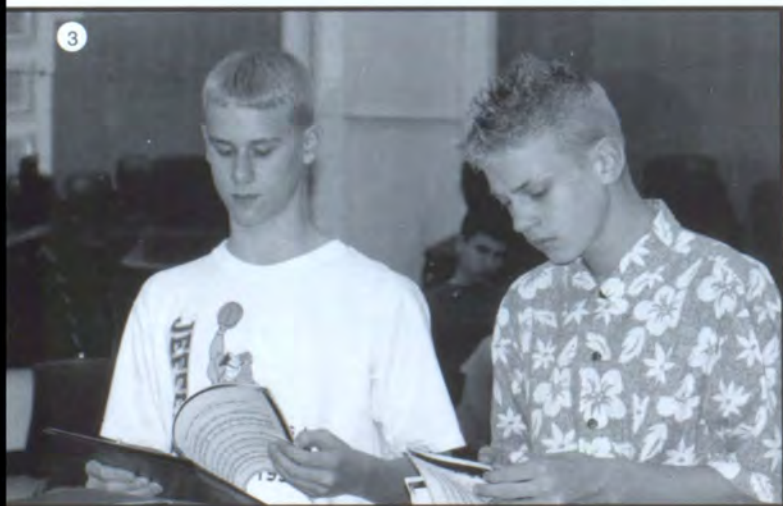
**Mr. Reese:** I'd say 60 to 70 hours a week, plus some Saturdays.

**Q:** Do you find it worthwhile to spend so much of your time on all the choirs and students that you teach?

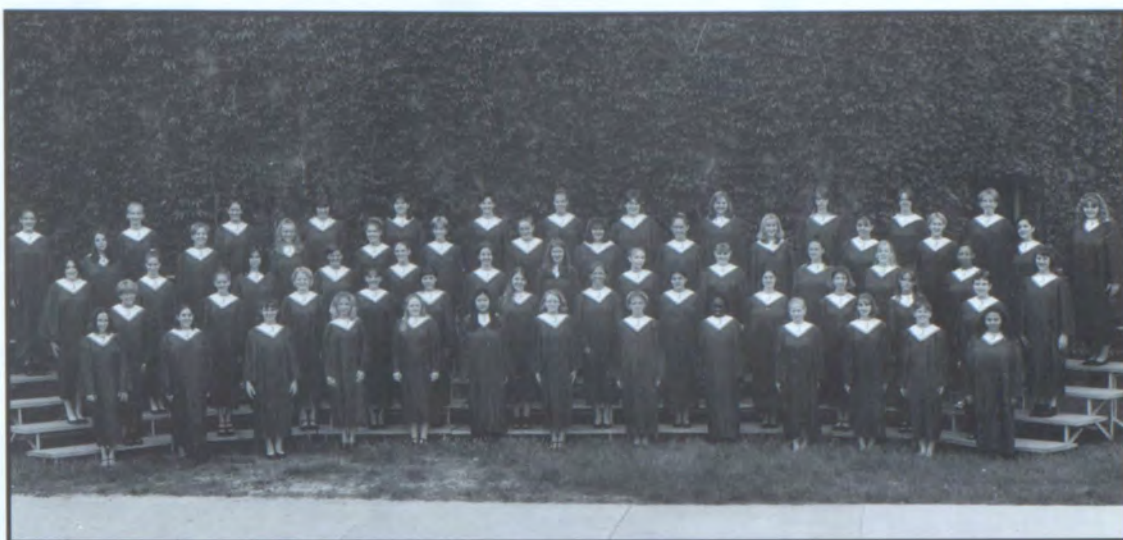
**Ms. Tralau:** Usually, yes.

**Mr. Reese:** Yes. It is fun to see the growth and achievements of each individual. Even if I have only helped one person. I feel that my time was well spent.

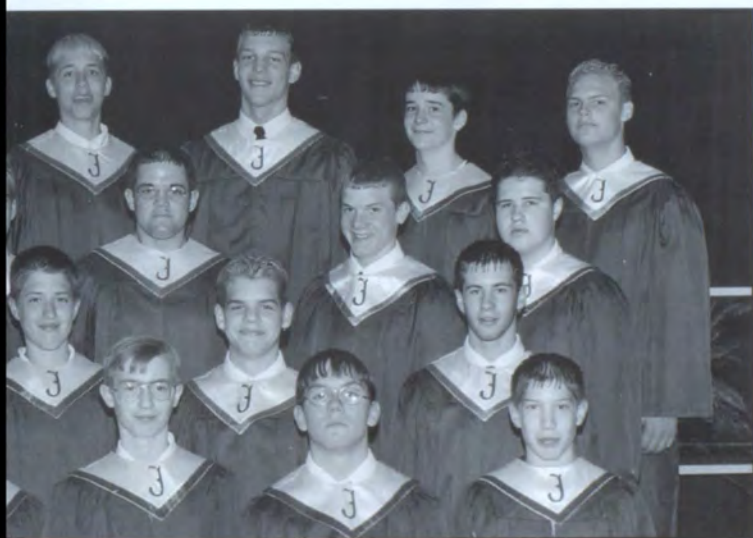

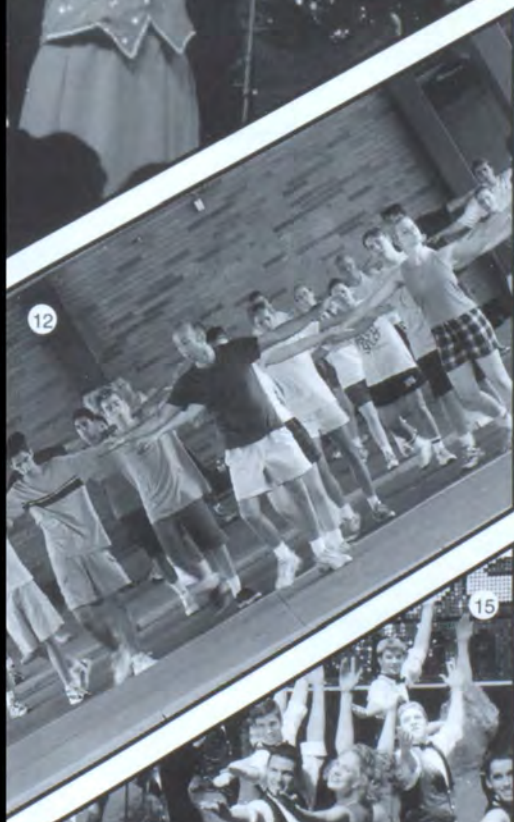

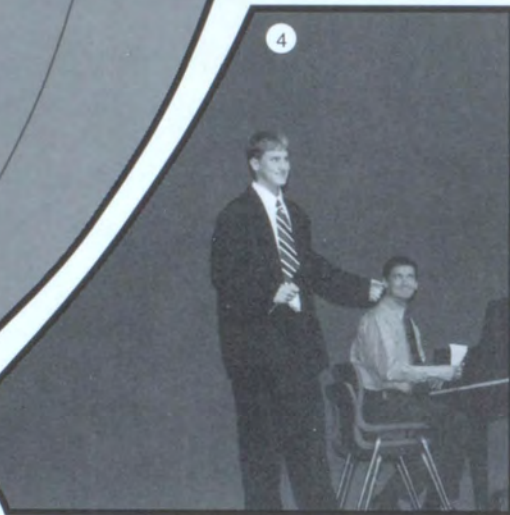

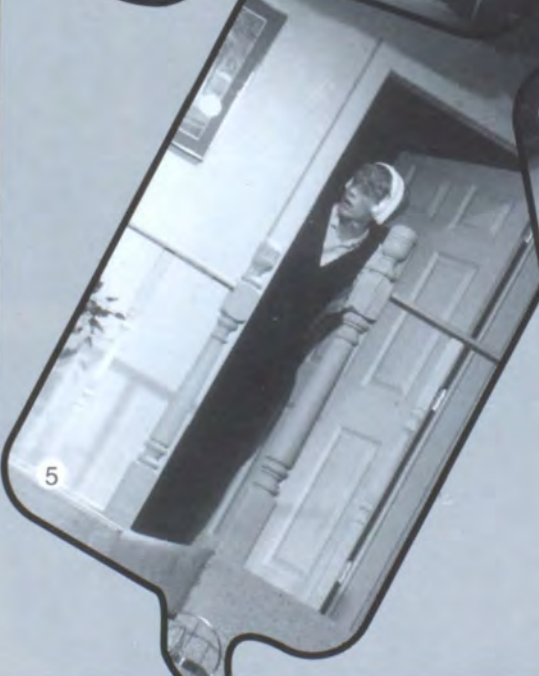

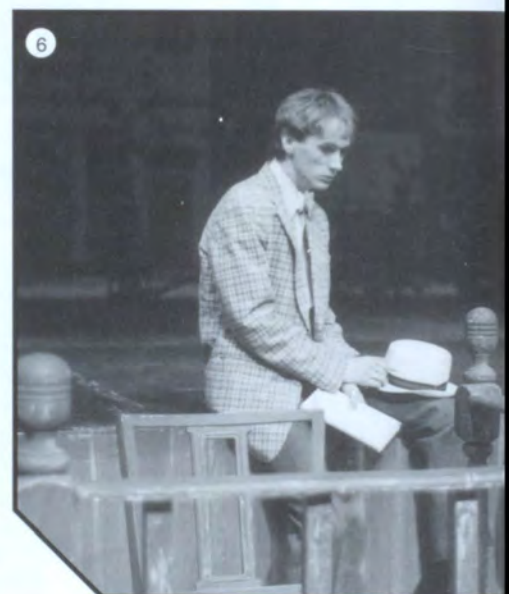

On March 24-26, the Jefferson Theater presented the spring play, "Inherit the Wind." This play is based on the famous "Scopes - Monkey Trial" of the early 1900's, which debated the constitutionality of teaching evolution in public schools. After the last show, all of the actors and technicians worked together to strike the set, pick up the dressing room, check in costumes, and clean the scene shop.

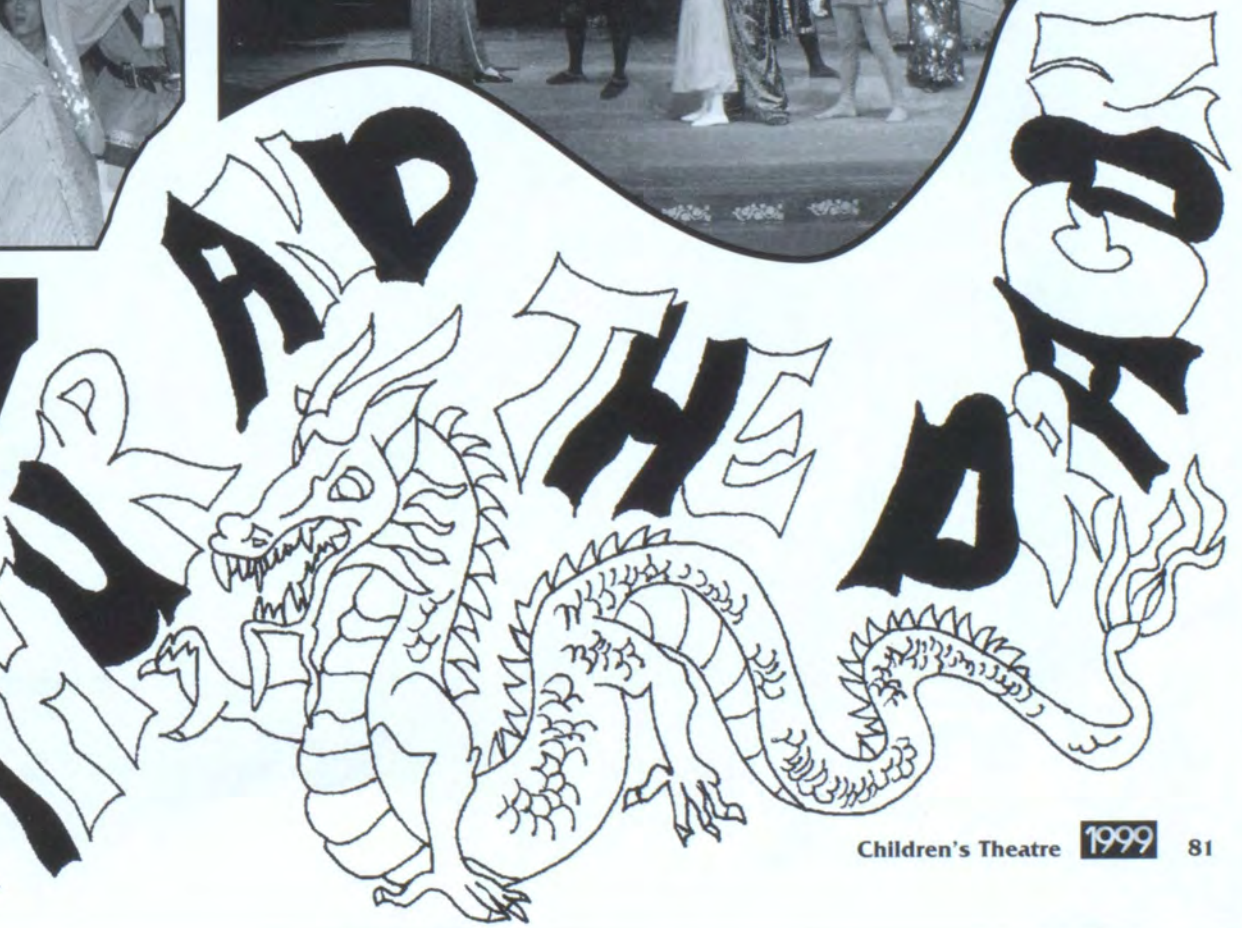

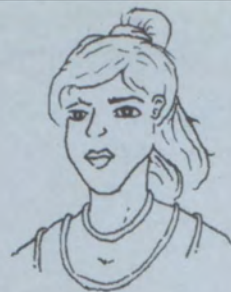

They beat 4th ranked North Scott and five hours later defeated Des Moines Lincoln 3-0 for the state title.

The victory marked not only the second straight state championship, but also the team's second straight 55-2 record. Over the past two seasons, the J-Hawks have compiled a 110-4 record, the best two year record for any state champion in the history of women's softball. Liz Erbe, Erin Quass, Tiffany Aschbrenner, and Kelli Azinger were named to the All-Tournament team.

# A rollercoaster year

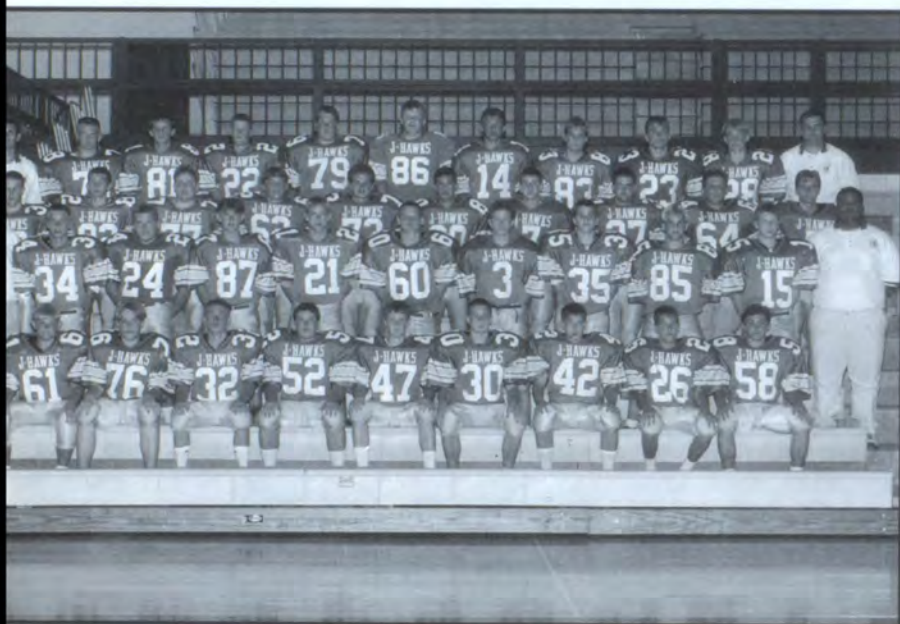

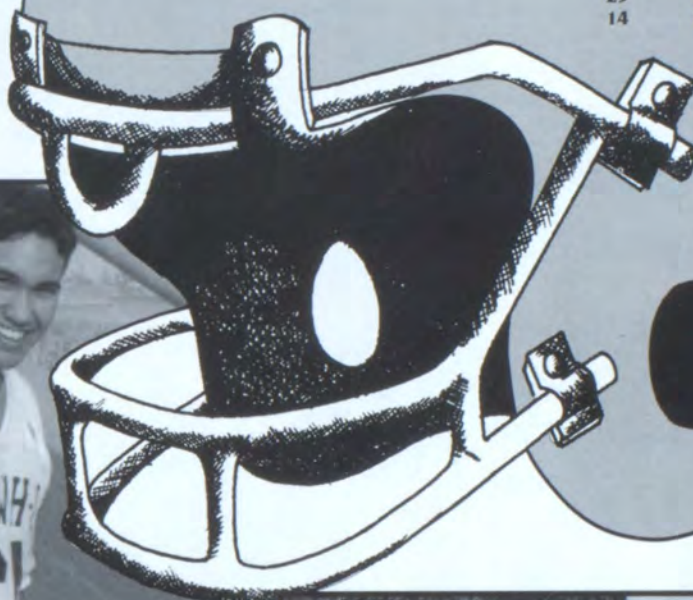

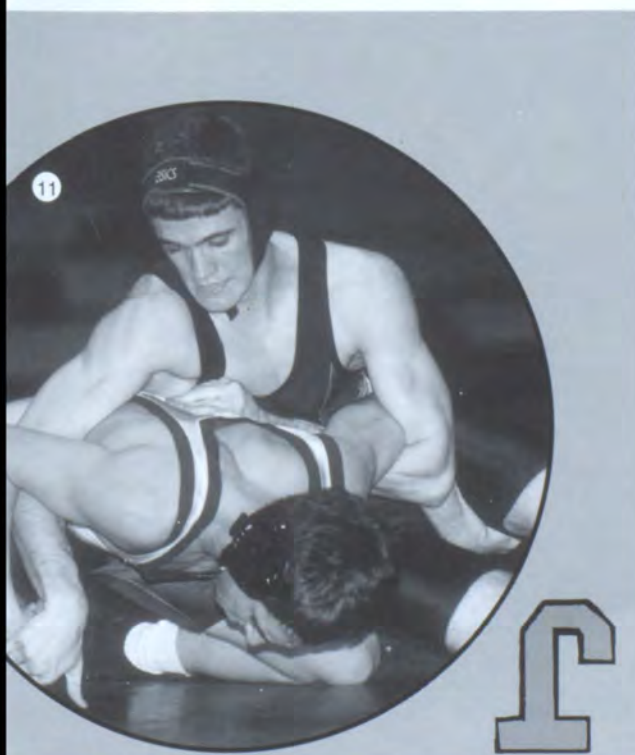
# Wrestlers make state

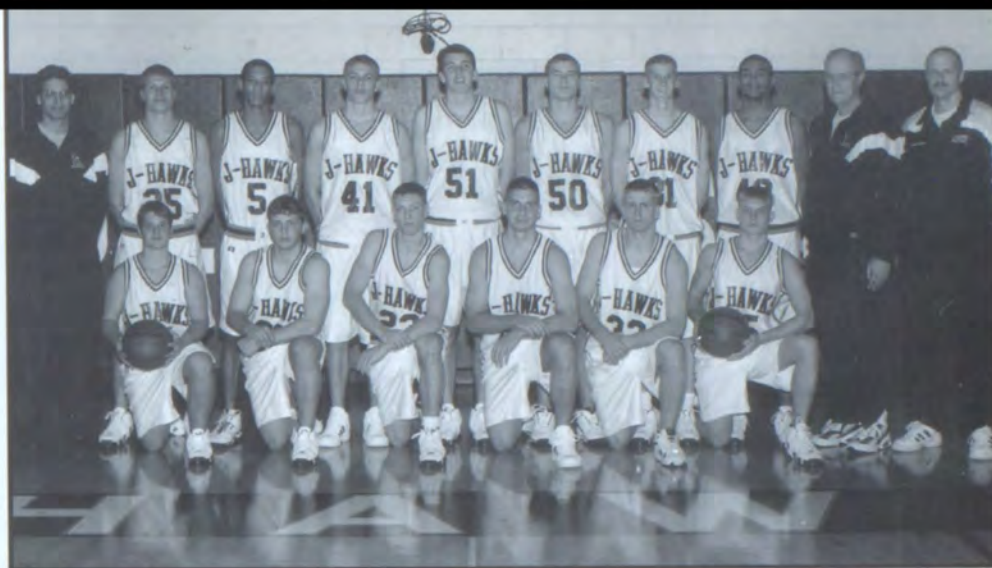
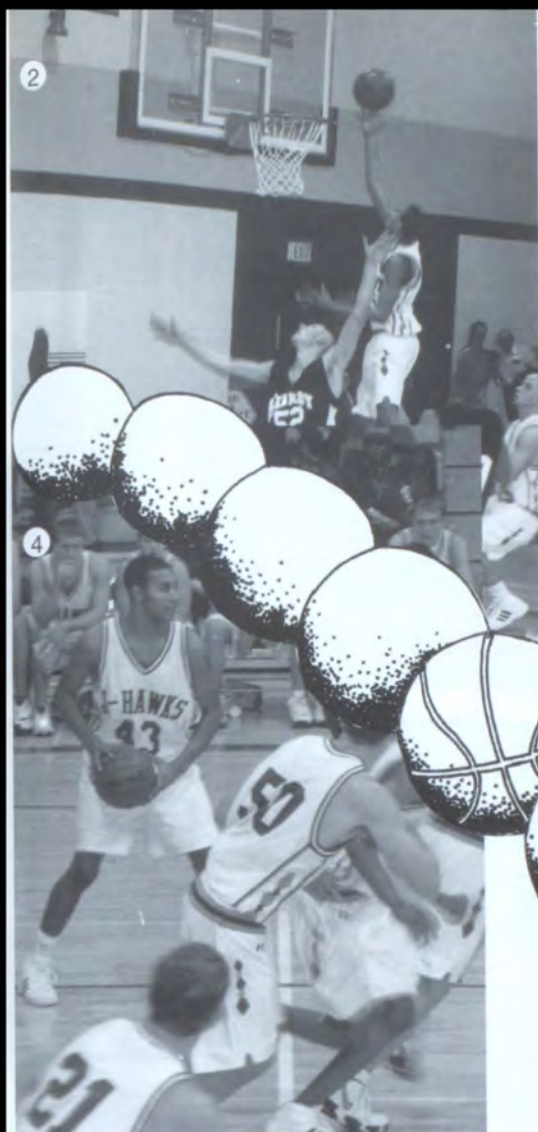
## JV squad had much talent

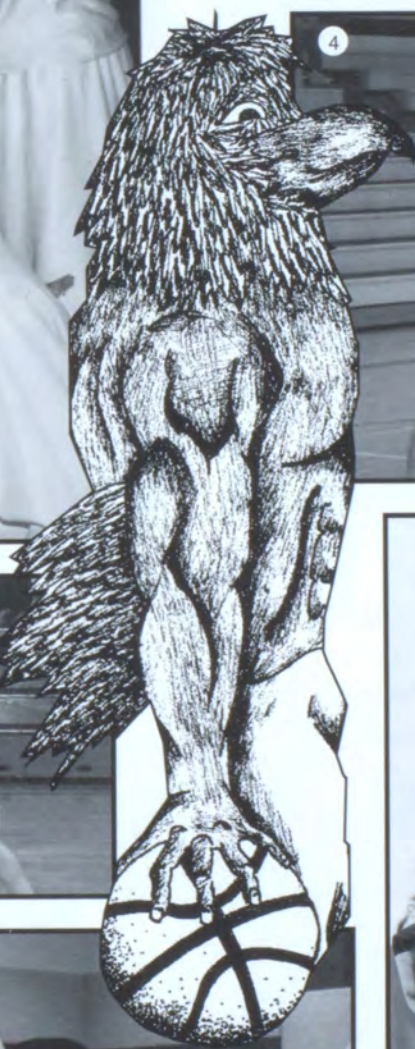

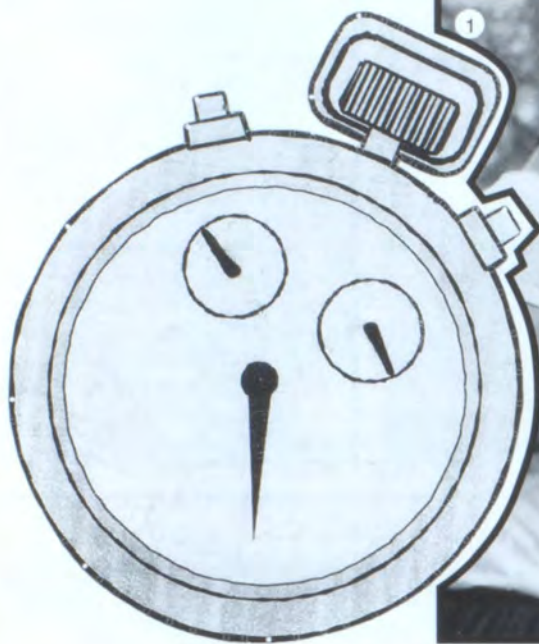

# Practices are hard

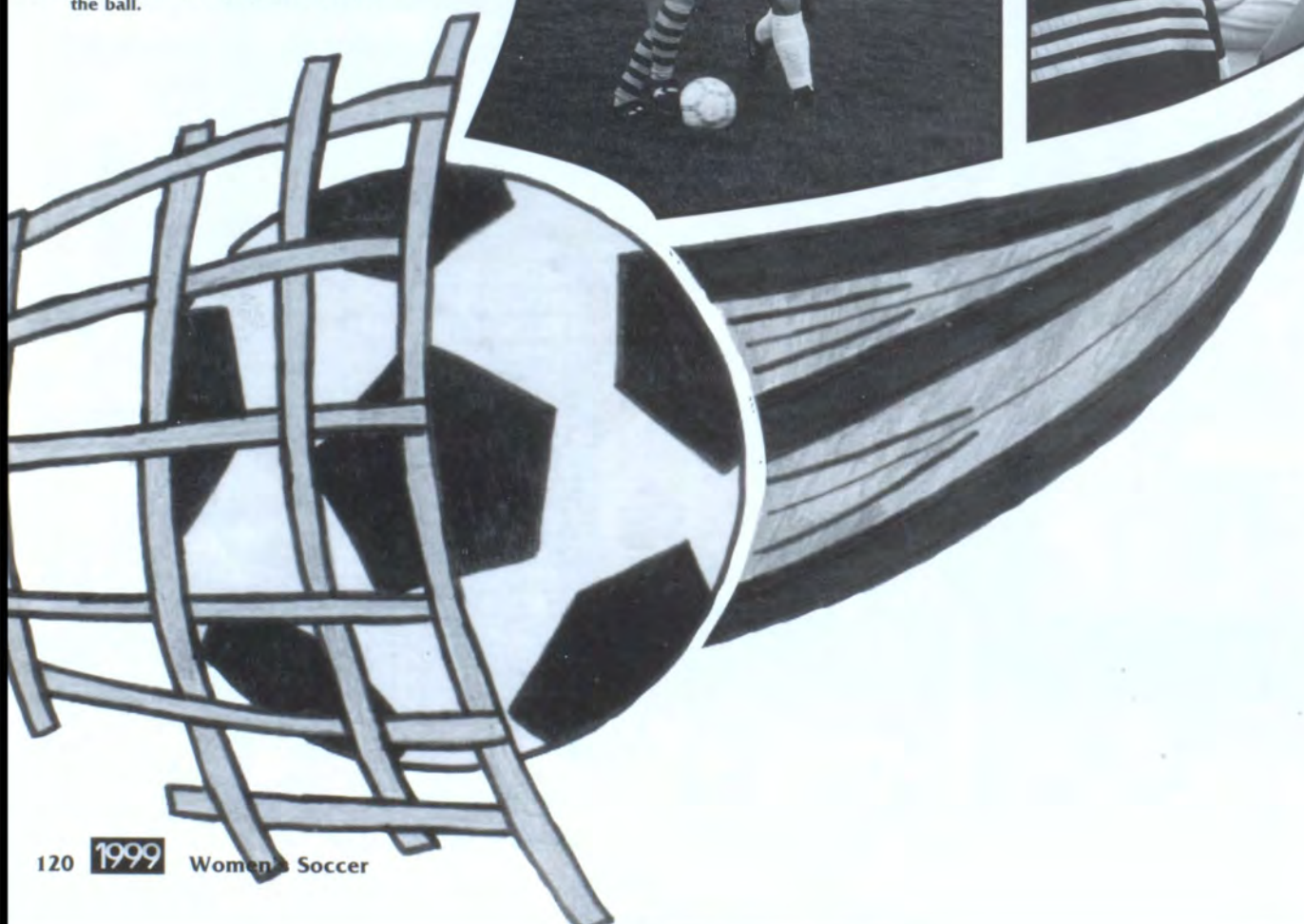

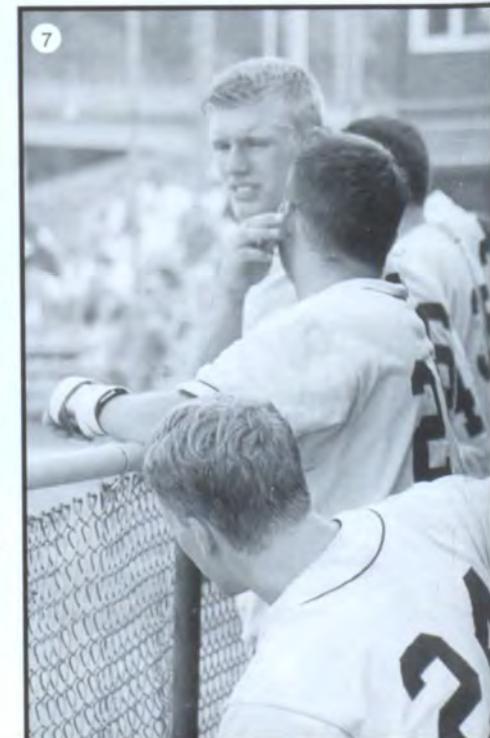

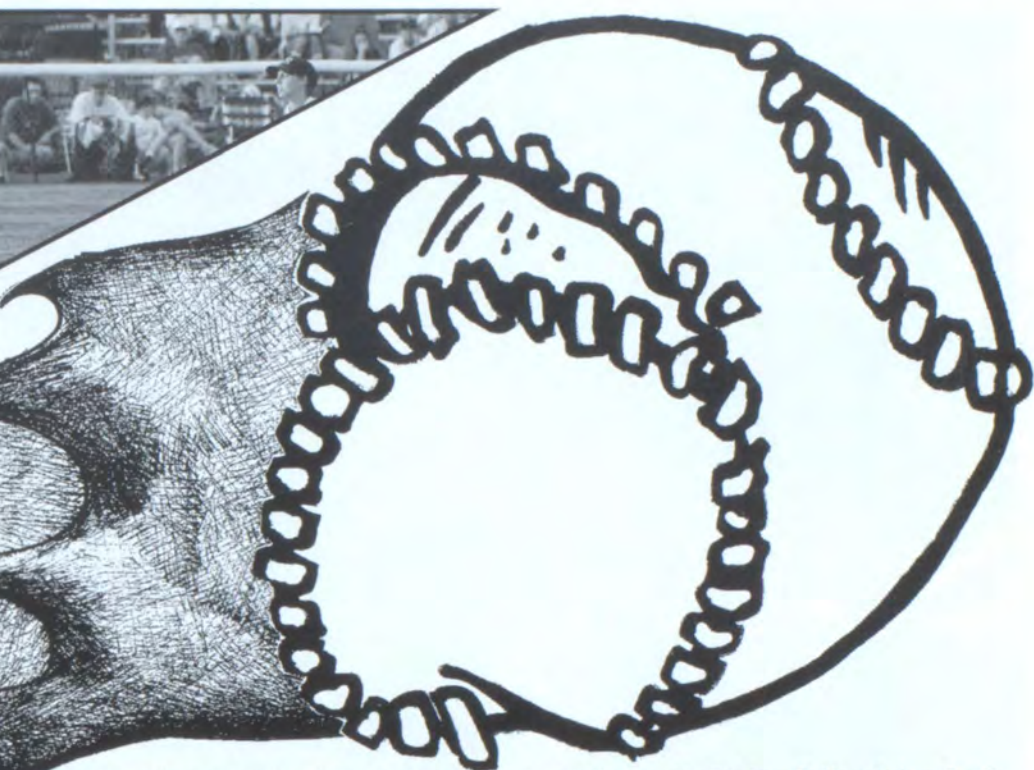
